The testing of the City of Norfolk's outdoor warning siren system will begin Tuesday, April 7, 2015 at 9:00 am. Faythe Petersen, Region 11 Emergency Management Coordinator, encourages Norfolk residents and those who live and/or work in Norfolk to plan ahead and know what they would do if the sirens were activated.

“If the sirens go off, you need to seek shelter and seek information which means turning on a radio or TV for local news,” Petersen said.

Shelter ideally means a basement but if there is not basement, stay away from windows and outside walls.

“There is no all clear signal so it's recommended to have a radio that carries local news or a weather radio along when entering a basement or storm safe area so that you can be
