Profits from the Norfolk library sale will be used to purchase items for the library including signage, extra equipment such as a new projector and projector screen, landscaping items, furniture, and paint.

"We encourage everyone to stop and buy some books or magazines and support their local library," Caldararo said.

It's a bibliophile paradise. Over ten thousand books will be sold by the Norfolk Public Library at a book sale in the Sunset Plaza Mall April 17th and 18th.

According to Mike Caldararo, Norfolk Library Administrator, there will be a wide selection of items available.

"We've had people donating items to us for this sale for months. We've gotten everything from House magazines to children's books to old books that any collector would love. There will also be brand new books at the sale," Caldararo said.

Bundles of magazines and pocket books will be sold for twenty-five cents. Paperbacks will be a dollar. Hardcover books will be two dollars. The sale will be held in a bay next to Herbergers. On Saturday, the 17th, the sale will be from 10 am to 7 pm. On the 18th, it will be from noon to 4 pm.

Members of the Norfolk Public Library Foundation thought of the idea of having a book sale last fall. Jim Curry, a member of the Foundation board, got the idea of a book sale from his father-in-law, a resident of Sioux City, Iowa, where the local library recently raised \$25,000 from its book sale.
