Experience a library, where real people take the place of traditional books. Norfolk Public Library and Northeast Community College Library will host the Human Library<sup>®</sup> locally on April 9, 2024.

At the Human Library, individuals volunteer to serve as open Books and share their experiences while engaging in conversation with Readers. These experiences can be personal, touching, enlightening, or even challenging. But common for all is that they offer an opportunity to get to know the stories in your community. Readers are encouraged to borrow a variety of open Books and engage in 30-minute personal conversations with each.

Event organizers, Anneka Ramirez and Jen Ippensen, say that by making the Human Library available locally, they aim to reach a wide audience and help people make connections and learn about one another through curiosity, conversation, and questions.

Suggested questions and other resources will be available for Readers, including American Sign Language and Spanish interpreters.




Kids' craft kits are for ages 4 and up. This month's kit is a spring bouquet.
